

Mohammad Ghanbari is an Emeritus Professor at the School of Computer Science and Electronic Engineering, University of Essex, United Kingdom and a Professor at the school of Electrical and Computer Engineering, University of Tehran, Tehran, Iran. He is internationally best known for the pioneering work on layered video coding, which earned him IEEE Fellowship in 2001 and he was also promoted to IEEE Life Fellow in 2014. He has registered for thirteen international patents and published more than 600 technical papers on various aspects of video networking, many of which have had fundamental influences in this field. These include: video/image compression, layered/scalable video coding, video transcoding, motion estimation, and video quality metrics. He is the author and co-author of 9 books, and his book video coding: an introduction to standard codecs, published by IET press in 1999, received the Rayleigh prize as the best book of year 2000 by IET.
